

DIRECTIONS TO KELSTON VILLAGE HALL, KELSTON, BATH, BA1 9AG

The village of Kelston lies on the A431 between Bath and Bristol.



FROM THE M4, J18

From J18 follow the A46, signposted Bath. After about 4 miles you will come to a roundabout where the A46 meets the A420. Turn right here, signposted Bristol. Stay on the A420 (going through Wick) until you reach Bridgegate and a double mini roundabout opposite a pub called The Griffin. Turn left here signposted A4175, Keynsham, Oldland and Bitton. Stay on the A4175 through Oldland Common until you reach the A431. Turn left here, signposted Bath. You will go through Bitton and Swineford before you reach Kelston. In Kelston, you will pass the Old Crown on your left and you will see an Italianate style house straight in front of you on a sharp left hand bend. Turn right here – it is signposted 'No Through Road'. Kelston Village Hall is at the bottom of this road on the left with a name sign in the wall.

FROM THE M4, J19

From J19, take the M32 towards Bristol following the signs for 'Ring Road A4174'. After about half a mile, leave the M32 at J1. Turn left here, following 'Ring Road A4174 Kingswood'. Go straight ahead at the large set of traffic lights then stay on the Ring Road A4174 for approximately 7 miles and 7 roundabouts. When you reach Kingsfield Roundabout, (it is clearly marked and Aspects Leisure Centre is on the right hand side) turn left, signposted Longwell Green, Willsbridge A431. Go straight across at the next roundabout, you will see Asda on your left and Next and M&S on your right. Go straight ahead at the traffic lights, following signs to Bath A431.

At the next roundabout, turn left on to the A431, signposted Longwell Green, Willsbridge, Bitton. Shortly after the roundabout, you will pass a rank of shops on your left including a Tesco Express. Shortly after this, bare left at a roundabout and go down into a dip and up the other side into Willsbridge. In Willsbridge, turn left at the roundabout, following Bath A431. There is a BP garage on the right just past the roundabout. Stay on the A431, going through Bitton and Swineford before you reach Kelston. In Kelston, you will pass the Old Crown on your left and you will see an Italianate style house straight in front of you on a sharp left hand bend. Turn right here – it is signposted 'No Through Road'. Kelston Village Hall is at the bottom of this road on the left with a name sign in the wall.

FROM THE A39/A37

If you are approaching Bath from Shepton Mallet, stay on the A37, signposted Bristol. Ignore the turning at the top of the hill just past Shepton Mallet which says Bath A367 as this will bring you into Bath on the wrong side of the city. If you are approaching from Wells, stay on the A39 which merges with the A37 at Farrington Gurney.

On the other side of Farrington Gurney turn right on to the A39, signposted Bath. You will go through Hallatrow, High Littleton, Farmborough, Marksbury and Corston, before passing the entrance to Bath Spa University on your right. You will then come to a roundabout where the A39 meets the A4, a pub called the Globe on your right, and a very large house on the hill opposite. This is Kelston Park which is very close to where you are heading.

Take the 2nd exit 'A4 Bath' here, along the dual carriageway. At the end of the dual carriageway, take the left fork (still on the A4) signposted Weston, RUH, Newbridge, and Park & Ride. Go past the Park & Ride and take the first turning left up Old Newbridge Hill. Turn left again at the top – a nasty hairpin bend.

You are now on the A431 leaving Bath and heading towards Bristol. About a mile on, you will pass Kelston Park on the left hand side – the house you saw from the roundabout. A little further along you will come into the village of Kelston itself. As the road goes into a sharp right hand bend, turn left – it is signposted 'No Through Road'. Kelston Village Hall is at the bottom of this road on the left with a name sign in the wall.

FROM THE A36

This is a quick and direct route which avoids having to cross the city centre.

Several miles before you reach Bath on the A36, you will go through the village of Woolverton. Turn left here on to the B3110, signposted Norton St Philip. Go through Norton St Philip, Hinton Charterhouse and Midford. A mile or so past Midford you will pass a pub called the Cross Keys on the right and you will then come to a double mini roundabout with an Esso petrol station on your left. Turn left here going past Sainsbury's on your left and St Martins Hospital on your right. Go straight ahead at the next roundabout - there is a pub here called the Red Lion. Stay on this road for about 3 miles, passing Bath Community Academy, Hillier Garden Centre and Haycombe Cemetery & Crematorium on your left. You will go into a steep dip and up the other side and arrive at a roundabout with the A4 and A39, a pub on your left called the Globe, and a very large house on the hill opposite. This is Kelston Park which is very close to where you are heading.

Take the 3rd exit 'A4 Bath' along the dual carriageway. At the end of the dual carriageway, take the left fork (still on the A4) signposted Weston, RUH, Newbridge, and Park & Ride. Go past the Park & Ride and take the first turning left up Old Newbridge Hill. Turn left again at the top – a nasty hairpin bend.

You are now on the A431 leaving Bath and heading towards Bristol. About a mile on, you will pass Kelston Park on the left hand side - the house you saw from the roundabout. A little further along you will come into the village of Kelston itself. As the road goes into a sharp right hand bend, turn left – it is signposted 'No Through Road'. PUBLIC TRANSPORT LINKS

If you are travelling to Bath by train, you will need to catch either the 319 or the 37 bus to Kelston. The railway and bus stations are right next door to one another. You can also get a 37 bus from Bristol Bus Station to Kelston.

The village of Kelston falls between 'Newbridge, Oldfield School' and 'Bitton, White Hart' on the timetable. The bus stops in Kelston outside the Old Crown pub. After you get off the bus, walk towards Bath keeping the pub on your left and the pub car park on your right. You will see an Italianate style house straight in front of you on a sharp left hand bend. Turn right here – it is signposted 'No Through Road'. Kelston Village Hall is at the bottom of this road on the left with a name sign in the wall. It's about a 3 minute walk from the bus stop.
